PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Fellow CSA members,

Attending annual meetings, volunteering for service, and contributing to our society journal help our members to network and connect to fellow agronomists. CSA membership stands at 89 as of September 30, 2018. The Canadian Journal of Plant Science (CJPS) is our society journal and members participate by contributing manuscripts and serving as editors. The CJPS is supported by three societies: the CSA, the Canadian Weed Science Society (CWSS), and the Canadian Society of Horticultural Sciences (CSHS). The journal currently has two Editors-in-Chief with staggered terms: Brian Beres (CSA) and Chris Willenborg (CWSS). Chris will be stepping down at the end of this year. Going forward the board will have three technical editors, each representing a different society, as well as an Editor-in- Chief. The CSA executive includes Ali Navabi (Past President); Helen Booker (President); Jaswinder Singh (President Elect), Douglas Cattani (Secretary, Treasurer), Gurcharn Singh Brar (Student Representative), Sheri Strydhorst and Harpinder Randhawa (Western Directors), and David Hooker and Mumtaz Cheema (Eastern Directors). The CSA executive met via conference call 12 times over the year and released fall and spring newsletters to our membership. The CSA executive also organized a joint ASA-CSSA-CSA conference Enhancing Productivity in a Changing Climate, which will take place in Baltimore, Maryland, USA from November 4 to 7, 2018. The CSA plant breeding committee chaired by Andrew Burt (Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada) will host a symposium entitled Germplasm exchange and the future of plant breeding. Invited speakers include Tom Michaels, Professor, Department of Horticultural Sciences, University of Minnesota; Jose Costa, United States Department of Agriculture; Marc de Wit, Canadian Food Inspection Agency; and Kofi Agblor, Managing Director, Crop Development Centre, University of Saskatchewan. This session will address many plant breeders' questions around intellectual property (IP) considerations under UPOV '91, an agreement that does not mention germplasm sharing as such and is more about granting royalties; however, one impacts the other, especially at the institutional level and above. The CSA awards and recognition luncheon and annual general meeting will be held during the conference. Outstanding scientific oral and poster presentations will be recognized by the CSA Graduate Student Oral and Poster Awards Program. Finally, Barb Sanipelli and our long-time Executive Director (ED) Steve Sheppard both retired this year. As of June 2018, Nancy Zubriski assumed roles of ED, Registrar, and Book Keeper for our Society.

2018 CSA Distinguished Agronomist Award

The Distinguished Agronomist Award is given to a duly nominated member of 15 years or more of regular membership plus appropriate credits as stated by the nominators. This award will be for a member who is nearing retirement age or who has retired.

Dr. Yousef Papadopoulos is the recipient of the 2018 CSA Distinguished Agronomist Award. Dr. Papadopoulos' contributions to the Canadian and international Crop Science community, his significant roles as CSA President, President Elect and Past President, his role in the Editorial Board of the Canadian Journal of Plant Science first as an Associate Editor and then as the Editor-In-Chief, and his contributions to the education of highly qualified personnel over the years were all factors considered by the Awards Committee in their unanimous endorsement of Dr. Papadopoulos' nomination.

2018 CSA Fellow Award

The CSA awards a Fellowship to a member of the CSA with 10 years standing and a distinguished record of service in any field of agronomy. The recipient of the Fellowship Award will be named "Fellow of the Canadian CSA of Agronomy".

Dr. Tarlok Singh Sahota is the recipient of the 2018 CSA Fellow Award. Dr. Sahota is being recognized for his work with the Canadian and International scientific community in Agronomy, dedication to the farming community in North Western Ontario, significant participation in the CSA Executive and contributions to the mentorship of students and personnel as an adjunct faculty with Lakehead University. Dr. Sahota's dedication and commitment have served to keep the community of CSA vibrant, relevant and innovative.
